

Instructions to Authors

Biomedicine & Pharmacotherapy comprises the following: editorials (three typewritten pages); short general reviews (seven pages); original articles (eight pages, four tables, four figures); correspondence (two pages, one table or one figure), notes, news, clinical studies; clinical trials; papers concerning biomedicotechnology, biomedico-economy, biomedico-epistemology, biomedico-politics will also be published.

1. Submitting a manuscript

On submission of an article for publication, the author guarantees that the article is original, that it has not been submitted for publication to another journal, and that it has not been previously published. Authors must submit their manuscripts electronically, by using the EES (Elsevier Editorial System) submission tool at <http://ees.elsevier.com/biopha>.

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Technical requirements

- For PC Windows
 - NT 4, 2000, XP
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 - Adobe Acrobat Reader 6.0 or later (download free at: <http://www.adobe.fr/products/acrobat/readstep2.html>)
- For Macintosh
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MS Word or Word or perfect can be used for text files.

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2. Presentation of manuscripts

- Original articles should, when possible, be set out under the following subheadings: Summary; Introduction; Materials and methods; Results; Discussion and Conclusion, References.

- The author’s hospital, institute, research centre or university address should be given on the title page of the article, together with his telephone/fax number and e-mail.
- The Summary should consist of no more than 250 words stating the key points of the article. The summary should be written in a clear and concise style so that all readers, whatever their speciality or discipline, can understand them. No bibliographic citation should be included.

- Figures: Please use TIF, EPS or JPEG (high resolution) formats; the resolution should be sufficient for the print size required. These should be supplied in separated files. Figures included in the text file are difficult to use. Figures should be numbered and must be cited in the text; each figure requires a caption. Every colour figure will be included in the electronic version, but will be printed in black and white. If colour reproduction is essential then the authors will be required to pay the cost of colour printing.
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- The editor can request that necessary modifications to the content and form of articles be made and will not accept the article for publication until the various instructions given above have been complied with.
